# Signs of APD

**Children with APD can hear, but have trouble understanding what they hear, which can adversely affect educational achievement and behaviour.**

## Signs of APD include:

- Difficulties comprehending spoken language unless brief, clear and simple
- Hearing difficulty against other background sound
- Poor auditory memory (eg difficulty following instructions)
- Problems with speech, language, phonics, spelling, reading or written language.
